Chairman Dick Heidecker called the regular meeting to order on June 20, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. in the Columbia Town Hall.

After the Pledge of Allegiance, Rita Plata took roll call attendance: Trustees Dick Heidecker and Tony Manning were present. Trustee Mark Cunningham was absent due to being on vacation. Fiscal Officer Mandie Andrews was absent.

Fiscal Officer Andrews emailed all meeting reports to the Trustees.

Minutes from the regular meeting on June 5, 2023 were presented for approval. Approval was tabled until the next meeting when Trustee Cunningham will be present.

Bills and payroll totaling \$333,500.98 were presented for approval.

Motion Heidecker to pay bills and payroll totaling \$333,500.98. Seconded Heidecker. Vote unanimous.

CORRESPONDENCE RESPONSE:

Thank you letter from the Western Reserve Dalmatian Club for the use of a pavilion for their Puppy Match 2023.

Thank you letter from the Cartwright Family to the Trustees for the use of the park for their annual family reunion.

From the Columbia Local Schools, a letter of support for the 55 and over community proposed for the Hickory Nut Golf Course. The letter cites the tax advantages for the residents that would be derived from such a development.

SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT:

There was no one present from the Sheriff's Department.

ZONING INSPECTOR:

Permits – For June 1-20, 2023, Zoning Inspector Rick Lanzo reported issuing 22 permits for one shed/barn, three finished basements, 11 new single-family homes, one patio, one chicken coop, two pools, two decks and one pavilion. Year-to-date, 110 permits have been issued for new homes.

Violations – Lanzo requested a resolution to clean-up and mow the landscape at the Villa Camillus, 10515 East River Road.

Board of Zoning Appeals – The BZA's next regular meeting is on Monday July 24, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. No one applied for their June meeting.

Zoning Commission – The next regular Zoning Commission meeting is on Thursday, July 6, 2023, at 6:30 p.m.

Subdivision Status – Nothing new reported.

MS4'S – No complaints or problems reported.

ROAD DEPARTMENT:

Equipment – Service Director Bob Rundle reported all equipment up and running.

Issue I – Rundle is still waiting for OWPC to release the funds for the Redfern Road Reconstruction project. He can't schedule the contractor until the funds become available.

Rundle is working on a joint project with the Lorain County Engineer to resurface Root Road from Station Road to Sprague Road. Columbia Township is responsible for Root Road from Station Road to Osborne Road. Once the plans are finalized, Rundle will come back to the Board for permission to apply for the Issue I grant.

Rundle has also been working with Strongsville's Service Department about repaving their half of Marks Road. Strongsville has agreed to do their part. He explained their half was one of the reasons the project wasn't funded. Rundle said it is possible that Marks Road could get funded next year.

Subdivision Status – Nothing new reported.

Department Input – The road crew will continue repairing concrete roads. Fremont Avenue, Lafayette and Valley View Drives have been paved. Root Road was striped from Station Road to Osborne Road.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Personnel – Chief Anthony reported 39 members on file and 36 members on call.

Calls – To date, the department has responded to 339 calls.

Transport Billing – Billing receipts through June 15th totaled \$4,814.24. Year-to-date billing totals \$59,517.48.

Mutual Aid – Mutual aid has been given 26 times and requested 20 times.

Station Coverage – All hours offered are being covered.

Department Input – The radio has been removed from the old Rescue 2 and installed in the new rescue squad. Tomorrow, the power cot will be removed and also installed in the new squad. Rescue 2 is ready to go on GovDeals.

Chief Anthony reported the department has responded to a couple of house fires during the last few months.

There will be a blood drive at the Fire Station on Sunday, July 2nd, from 9 a.m. to 2 pm.

Chairman Heidecker commented that the Sheriff's new Community Impact Officer lives in the ABC streets.

CEMETERY:

Rita Plata reported the receipt of \$500 for one burial and \$500 for one footer fee.

OLD BUSINESS:

Cell Tower Lease – Action tabled until the next meeting on July 3, 2023 when Trustee Cunningham will be present.

Request for “No Engine Brake” Signage on Royalton Road – ODOT has not responded to the Trustees' request for this signage.

Streetlight at the Intersection of Osborne and Root Roads, East Side – Ohio Edison has not installed this streetlight yet.
